# Clarifying

When you do not understand something, you can do the following:

- Reread the sentence
- Identify parts of the word that you know
- Sound out the word
- Read the entire sentence again, does it make sense?
- Substitute a word or idea that might make sense in its place

# **Summarizing**

Strong Summaries always include:

- Important ideas and concepts
- Kev words
- Key places or locations
- Main characters
